### BBQ Safety

This unpredictable weather may make chances for a BBQ quite slim. However, it is always good to be prepared so this article will provide you with the basics on how to avoid a dodgy tummy and other BBQ related incidents.

You don't need to be too precious but if you follow a few basic rules, you can reduce the risk of yourself or your guests regretting the festivities due to food poison.

- All frozen meat should be thoroughly thawed out before you put it on the barbecue, if not it may appear to be cooked on the outside but will be raw on the inside. If you are unsure about defrosting times it may be best to buy fresh.
- Make sure your barbecue is hot enough before you start but don't get going too quickly; coals should be hot and glowing not flaming.
- Turn your meat regularly to ensure an event cook. Check meat is cooked all the way through before serving; make sure it's not still raw close to the bone or in the middle.
- If you touch raw meat or fish, wash your hands before touching ready-to-eat foods and do not put ready-to-eat foods on plates that have been used to carry raw meat or fish. You also want to avoid using any utensils for both raw and ready-to-eat foods.

- Keep all your side dishes in the fridge until you're ready to serve them. Although it may be tempting to lay everything out for your guests' arrival, food can quickly go bad when out in the heat. Once laid out in a shady spot ensure all items are covered to avoid any unwanted attention from flies or bugs that may spread germs. It is best to only keep food out for a maximum of 2 hours.

BBQ's can be fun but also dangerous so please see our advice to ensure you and your family and friends stay safe as possible.

- Make sure your barbecue is in good working order. If gas fuelled, make sure that all connections are securely attached and all gas canisters are free from damage.
- Ensure the barbecue is on a flat site, well away from a shed, trees or shrubs that could easily catch alight.
- Keep children, garden games and pets well away from the cooking area. Although it is great for children to take an interest in cooking, make sure to keep a close eye on any helpers. Make sure all children understand how hot and dangerous the BBQ is.
- Please ensure the BBQ is always attended. Have a sober adult designated to keep an eye out.

- Ensure the BBQ is cool before attempting to move it, never cover the BBQ with any material until the BBQ is completely cool.
- Ensure the BBQ is well ventilated to avoid build-up of Carbon Monoxide.
